The kids at the mission are growing up. They are the “Second Generation” of immigrants. Some are true Americans because they were born in this country. Others are not so lucky and can’t call any country “home.”

Rosena is one of my favorite kids at the mission. I’ve known her for over 12 years. She’s 19 now. She dropped out of high school after failing her freshman year twice. She’s lived at home and with girl friends for the last several years. Recently she came by the mission to see me.

“Hey, Mr. Tim!” Rosena had her little sister by the hand.

“Howdy, Rose. How ya doin’?”

“Well, I’m pregnant!” She patted her belly.

“Congratulations! How far along are you?”

“Four months.”

“What’s the father say?”

“He wants a DNA test. He doesn’t want to support me at all.”

“That figures. Have you seen the doctor?”

“Four months ago to tell me I’m pregnant. They want \$1,200 to see me again.”

“So you haven’t been back?”

“No.”

“That’s not good. You need to make sure that you’re getting the right vitamins and food. I’m going to write down the name of one of my partners. She’ll help you get what you need.” I wrote down the information and handed her the card.

“I’ll go by and see her,” she assured me.

The next week I followed up. . . .she hadn’t gone to see my partner.

Fortunately, I have another person on my team who helps us at the missions. She’s a RN and specializes in babies. I introduced her to the family. Even when there is help, just getting it can be a problem. Either they can’t get to the building, or they can’t fill out the forms, or they don’t have the right identification cards, the problems seem endless.

That’s why we “Take the Church, to the People.” I thank God for our team that cares enough to go the extra mile—literally! Your support of our ministry makes the difference in the life and death of our residents. I thank God that Rosena chose LIFE and not the abortion clinic!



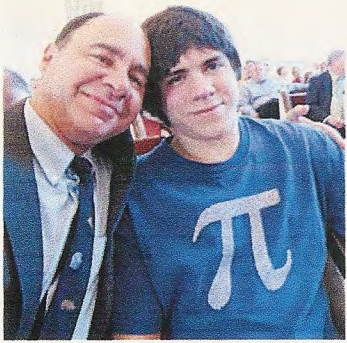
